All equine classes will run under the rules and regulations of the British Show Pony Society and UK Horses and Ponies Limited unless stated otherwise. The current rules and regulations can be found in the BSPS 2025 rulebook or the UK Horses and Ponies Limited rulebook 2025, both of which can be found on their individual association websites.

Driffield Show is holding DIRECT QUALIFIERS for Finals at **London International Horse Show in December 2025**. For more information, please see the full list of Rising Star rules in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website. www.britishshowhorse.org

Driffield show is also holding **Horse of the Year Show 2025 Qualifiers** for In- Hand Shire of the Year supported by the Shire Horse Society. **HOYS Fees are not refundable.**

If entering a Horse of the Year Show qualifying class, you must include ALL the relevant HOYS ID numbers, i.e. owner/exhibitor, animal, rider, agent, and postcodes on the form so that your entry can be processed. If you don't have your HOYS ID numbers, please contact Grandstand Media Equine Section on Tel: 02476 858205.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependent on breed/type of animal, spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

Important Equine Updates for 2025

Entry Numbers

Due to the increased popularity of the various equine classes available at Driffield Show this year, the entries are limited per class to ensure the safety of all competitors in the main ring, it is therefore recommended entry forms per competitor are received in sufficient time.

Main Ring

If an equine exhibitor falls off in the main ring, they will not be allowed to remount. First Aid will be offered in the first instance, competitors enter the main ring at their own risk and ability.

Trimming of Sensory Hairs

All equines competing at Driffield Show should present with no evidence of whiskers or sensory hairs having been trimmed or removed (other than for veterinary purposes in which case you must provide written proof from your Vet; this proof must be available at the Show if requested by a Show Official).

Sensory hairs are the hard hairs located on the horse's muzzle and around the eyes, also known as 'whiskers' that are used for sensation.

Trophies

It is encouraged that all eligible trophy winners stay for the Grand Parade to be presented their trophy by the President of the Driffield Agricultural Society. However, it is understandable if exhibitors need to leave the showground earlier. Trophies can therefore be collected and signed for from the Equine Secretary's tent. The trophies are kept for a year and **must** be returned.

Prize Money Prize money is to be collected from the banking kiosk, between the Members enclosure and next door to the main show office, prize money cards need to be signed by the Equine Secretary and handed into the banking kiosk team.

Stallions are not permitted in the showing classes at Driffield Showground unless competing in the Agricultural Horse sections and the Showjumping.

Equine Influenza

The minimum requirement is two vaccinations 21 days apart. There must be a clear 7 days, after the second vaccination before entry onto the showground, it is mandatory that all other horses/ponies have received a booster within 6 calendar months on their entry to the showground. Foals of 6 months of age or older must meet the above requirement. Foals of less than 6 months of age must be out of a mare that meets the above requirements. Passports may be inspected at any time.

QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Hunter Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

16. Small/Lightweight Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed exceeding 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Hunter Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Racehorse to Show Horse Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

23. LIHS Rising Star Cob - Lightweight & Heavyweight Cob type: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm, but not exceeding 155cm. Rider to be 15yrs or over. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Cob final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

24. LIHS Maxi Cob type:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. Rider to be 15yrs or over. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). All competitors to receive a rosette. All ponies to be plaited unless a Native breed.
26. **Open First Ridden Pony** - mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 122cms riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January 2025. All ponies to be plaited unless a Native breed.

MINI CHAMPIONSHIP. Open to ponies that have been placed 1st. or 2nd in classes 25 & 26.

27. **Mixed Height Open Show Pony** - Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). Riders must be correct age for the height of pony they ride. All ponies to be plaited.
28. **Mixed Height Open Show Hunter Pony** - Mare or gelding 4 years old or over. Not exceeding 153cms. Riders must be correct age for the height of pony they ride. All ponies to be plaited.

Please note that classes 27&28 will be combined but will be judged separately. Both classes will enter the ring at the same time.

29. **Local Ridden Pony** - not exceeding 14.2hhs (148cms). Suitable for and to be ridden by a rider aged 16 and under and living within a 22-mile radius of Driffield Showground. Turnout taken into consideration. No lead reins allowed. Pony or rider must not be registered with BSPS, NPS or Ponies UK
30. **Fancy dress** – Open to all ages of rider. Any breed, height, and age of horse/pony. Can be mounted or In-hand.

Please note the Fancy Dress will take place and be judged before the Grand Parade

SHOW REGULATIONS

GENERAL

1. Neither the Society nor any of its Officers or Servants shall in any way be responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstance whatsoever) to visitors, exhibitors, Servants or anyone attending the show, or to any exhibit or any other property brought into the showground, or for anything else in connection with or arising out of, or attributable to the Society's Show.
2. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Secretary and Society Officers and Servants against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
3. The Society reserves the absolute right to refuse or reject, unconditionally, any entry.
4. Any person making false entry, or who has given a false certificate, shall forfeit any unpaid prize money and shall be disqualified from exhibiting at the Society's show.
5. All stock must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
6. It's a condition of entry, that all stock exhibited is sufficiently trained and under control of a competent handler. Bulls must have two handlers. All exhibitors, whilst in the show rings should wear a white coat, or as prescribed by the Breed Society.
7. Exhibitors in the Cattle and Grand Parade are requested to note that, for safety reasons, children of and under the age of 16 years, will not be allowed to lead animals or accompany exhibitors into the cattle or main rings whilst the parades are taking place unless accompanied by an adult.
8. All distance for radius classes shall be measured on the Ordnance Survey Map.
9. In no case will the Society or its committee be responsible for any loss from accident or mistake or damage to any exhibits or packages, though every care will be taken for their safety.
10. The ages of exhibits will be calculated to the date fixed for the closing of entries unless stated otherwise.
11. If required, Certificates of the ages of animals entered must be delivered to the Secretary. The attention is drawn to the provision of the state health schemes in relation to MV and CAE and their responsibility to observe such rules and regulations. For its part, the Society will provide separate accommodation and guidelines to ensure that necessary controls are taken to preserve accredited status of the animals shown at the show.
12. A condition of entry is that you MUST comply with all current Animal Health and Welfare legislation regarding identification disease control and movements.

TO ENTER

All entries to be made in writing to the Secretary and each exhibitor shall sign such certificates as shall be required by the Secretary at the time of entry. All livestock and Carcase entries **CLOSE ON 10TH JUNE, 2025** but the committee nevertheless reserve the right to accept entries up to such a time as they think fit. **NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR JUDGING UNLESS IT APPEARS IN THE CATALOGUE.**

13. All entry fees to be paid at the time of entry and no entry will be accepted without payment of the prescribed fees.

JUDGING

14. In all sections, the Judge's decision is final.
15. In all sections, no person other than the appointed Judges, Stewards and Committee Members shall be in any marquee or place of judging at the time of judging.
16. In any of the classes for livestock, where 7 entries are actually exhibited a fourth prize may be given.
17. The Committee reserves the right to split any livestock class, should the number of entries warrant it.
18. Where there are not more than 2 exhibitors in any class, such class may be cancelled, and where there are not more than 4 entries in and class the prize money can be reduced by one third.
19. The Judges will be empowered to withhold prize money when they are of the opinion that there is not sufficient merit in the stock exhibited to justify an award.
20. The Society reserves the right to withhold payment of prize money to any prize-winning exhibitor in the cattle, horses, ponies and heavy horses not parading in the Grand Parade.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

21. There will be a Grand Parade in the main ring of all prize winners of the horse and cattle sections. Any animals that are judged may leave the Showground at 4.00pm except the prize winners, which will parade in the grand parade.

OBJECTIONS

22. In the Livestock section, objections to be laid with the Secretary within half an hour of the class being judged, with a deposit of £20. Deposits will be returned if the objection is upheld.
23. If any dispute shall arise, or any objection made by an exhibitor or any other person, such dispute or objection shall be settled by the Committee, who may decide upon such evidence as may appear satisfactory to them, and their decision in all matters shall be final and conclusive and not subject to appeal. The Society also reserves the right to itself, by its Committee, and in addition to any other provision contained in these rules, the right to refuse or cancel entries or classes, and prohibit exhibition of entries, as the Committee may deem expedient.

CLAIMS

24. All claims for exhibits and selling classes etc must be made to the Secretary before 3.30pm on the day of the show. A commission of 10% will be charged on all sales. If any exhibit is claimed by two or more persons it will be sold by auction on the Showground at 3.45pm. Any amount realised beyond the catalogue price will be divided between the exhibitor and the Society except in selling classes, in which case the whole of the surplus shall go to the Society.
If any persons who have entered stock or other items and failed to exhibit the same shall forfeit all fee and charges paid on making their entries

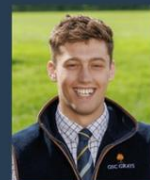
