SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The ages of exhibits will be calculated to the date fixed for the closing of entries unless otherwise stated.
2. All entries to be made in writing to the secretaries and each exhibitor shall sign such certificates as shall be required by the secretaries at the time of entry. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
3. **ALL HORTICULTURE ENTRIES PREFERABLY BY MONDAY, 11th JULY 2022** But the committee nevertheless reserve to themselves the right to accept entries up to such a later time as they think fit.
4. All Entrance Fees to be paid at the time of entry. No entry will be accepted without payment of the prescribed fee.
5. All cheques to be made payable to 'Driffield Agricultural Society'. Uncrossed Postal Orders preferred. Fees less than £1 in loose postage stamps or cash.
6. All exhibits to be removed before 6.00pm on Thursday 21st July but not before 5.00pm without permission.
No cars on the Showground before 6.00pm.
7. Any person who has given a false certificate or made a false entry shall forfeit any unpaid prize money and shall be disqualified from exhibiting at the Society's Shows.
8. No person other than appointed Stewards and Judges shall be in any Marquees during judging.
9. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor, except in floral Art Section. Any violation of this rule or any other Rules of the show renders the Exhibitor liable to disqualification and forfeits all prizes that have been awarded to such exhibitor. The Committee reserve the right to inspect the gardens of the exhibitors in all Horticultural Classes.
10. Staging will be erected by the Committee and a number of vases available to borrow but exhibitors must preferably provide their own vases, boxes, trays, etc. for cut flowers, also plates, dishes etc. for fruit and vegetables. Wiring of blooms and sprays will disqualify any exhibit. All staging in the amateur classes must be done by the exhibitor or any appointed Steward. No professional assistance allowed.
11. The Committee will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits but will use every care for their safety.
12. The Judges, whose decision will be final, will have the power to reserve or reduce the prizes where exhibits shall be considered not to possess sufficient merit, or recommend the addition of extra prizes.
13. Judging in the Horticultural Section will be under Royal Horticultural Society rules.
14. If any dispute shall arise, or any objection made by an exhibitor or any other person, such dispute or objection shall be settled by the Committee, who may decide upon such evidence as may appear satisfactory to them and their decision in all matters shall be final and conclusive and not subject to any appeal. The Society also reserves to itself, by its Committee and in addition to any other provision contained in these rules, the right to refuse or cancel any entries or classes and prohibit exhibition of entries as the Committee may deem expedient.
15. Entries from any person expelled from any other show will not be accepted.
