Driffield show is holding **Horse of the Year Show 2024 Qualifiers** for In- Hand Shire of the Year supported by the Shire Horse Society.

If entering a Horse of the Year Show qualifying class, you must include ALL the relevant HOYS ID numbers, i.e. owner/exhibitor, animal, rider, agent, and postcodes on the form so that your entry can be processed. If you don't have your HOYS ID numbers, please contact Grandstand Media Equine Section on Tel: 02476 858205. **HOYS Fees are not refundable.**

Important Equine Updates for 2024

Main Ring

If an equine exhibitor falls off in the main ring, they will not be allowed to remount. First Aid will be offered in the first instance, competitors enter the main ring at their own risk and ability.

Trimming of Sensory Hairs

All equines competing at Driffield Show should present with no evidence of whiskers or sensory hairs having been trimmed or removed (other than for veterinary purposes in which case you must provide written proof from your Vet; this proof must be available at the Show if requested by a Show Official).

Sensory hairs are the hard hairs located on the horse's muzzle and around the eyes, also known as 'whiskers' that are used for sensation.

Trophies

It is encouraged that all eligible trophy winners stay for the Grand Parade to be presented their trophy by the President of the Driffield Agricultural Society. However, it is understandable if exhibitors need to leave the showground earlier. Trophies can therefore be collected and signed for from the Equine Secretary's tent.

Prize Money Prize money to be collected from the banking kiosk next door to the show office, prize money cards need to be signed by the Equine Secretary and handed into banking kiosk team.

NO PONY STALLIONS are allowed on the Driffield Showground

Equine Influenza

The minimum requirement is two vaccinations 21 days apart. There must be a clear 7 days, after the second vaccination before entry onto the showground, it is mandatory that all other horses/ponies have received a booster within 6 calendar months on their entry to the showground. Foals of 6 months of age or older must meet the above requirement. Foals of less than 6 months of age must be out of a mare that meets the above requirements. Passports may be inspected at any time.

THE HENRY BEACHELL PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP Presented by Henry Beachell, Esq. This will be awarded to the exhibitor obtaining the most points in the Agricultural Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Pig and Carcase Classes. 1st Prize –3 points, 2nd Prize – 2 points and 3rd Prize – 1 point per exhibit in each class. No exhibitor may score more than 3 points in any one class and 12 points in any one breed section. In the case of a tie, the Exhibitor who has exhibited in the most species sections shall be declared the winner.

JUNIOR DRIVER RULES

- 1 The class is open to Junior Drivers over the age of 12 years and not exceeding 18 years old on the day of the show.
- 2 Horses must be aged four years and over. Stallions are not permitted in Junior driven classes.
- 3 Any suitable 2 wheeled vehicle may be used with appropriate and correctly fitted harness.
- 4 Junior Drivers must be accompanied in the vehicle, at all times, by an Experienced Heavy Horse Driver aged 18 years and over. A separate groom is required to stand at the horse's head when the horse and vehicle is standing still (ie not the person accompanying the driver).
- 5 When in the vehicle the Junior Driver and accompanying Experienced Driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest.
- 6 Junior Drivers must wear a current standard hard. They should wear gloves and be neatly and conservatively attired.
- 7 A driving whip should always be carried in the hand and consideration will be given to the correct use of the whip. The lash should be long enough to reach the horses shoulder.
- 8 Junior Drivers will be judged on their turnout and driving abilities, the type of vehicle and harness will be taken into consideration but will not be judged.
- 9 Junior Drivers will be required to enter the ring at a walk. They will be required to show a simple change of rein at trot during their individual show. A rein back will not be required.
- 10 At least the length of one horse should be maintained between each turnout. Where the distance cannot be maintained, drivers may turn across the ring into another space. Direct overtaking is not permitted.
- 11 In the event of the Junior Driver getting into difficulty, the Experienced Driver must take the reins immediately, and when safe to do, request permission from the Steward to leave the ring.
- 12 On the day of the show the Junior Driver must be covered by their own independent public liability insurance.

This class will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk. **Exhibitors, please note that the HOYS contribution fee of £18 is payable for this class and the HOYS entry form is required in addition to that for the Show.** The Show reserves the right to share membership data with Grandstand Media Limited in compliance with the Horse of The Year Show (HOYS) Rules and Regulations. This sharing is for the purpose of HOYS matters to include, but not limited to, qualification or disciplinary. 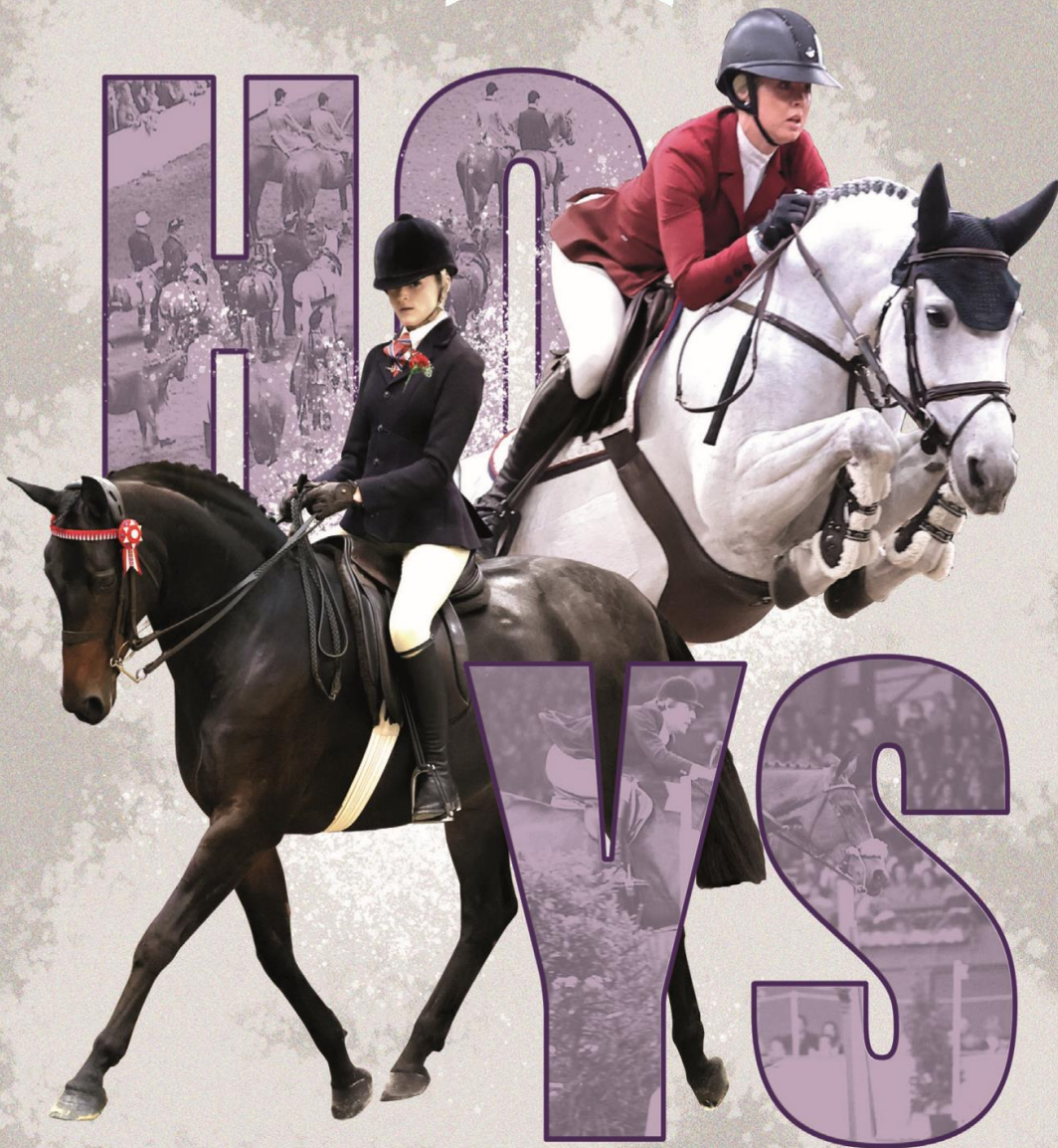
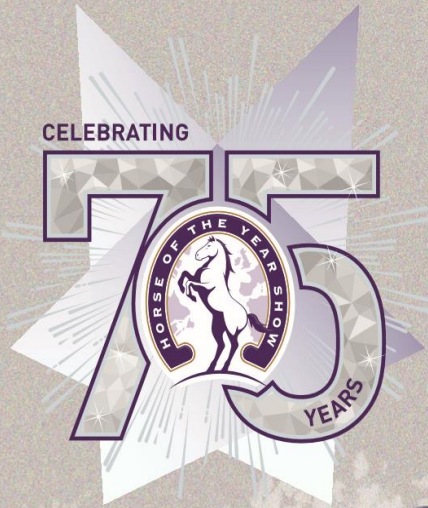

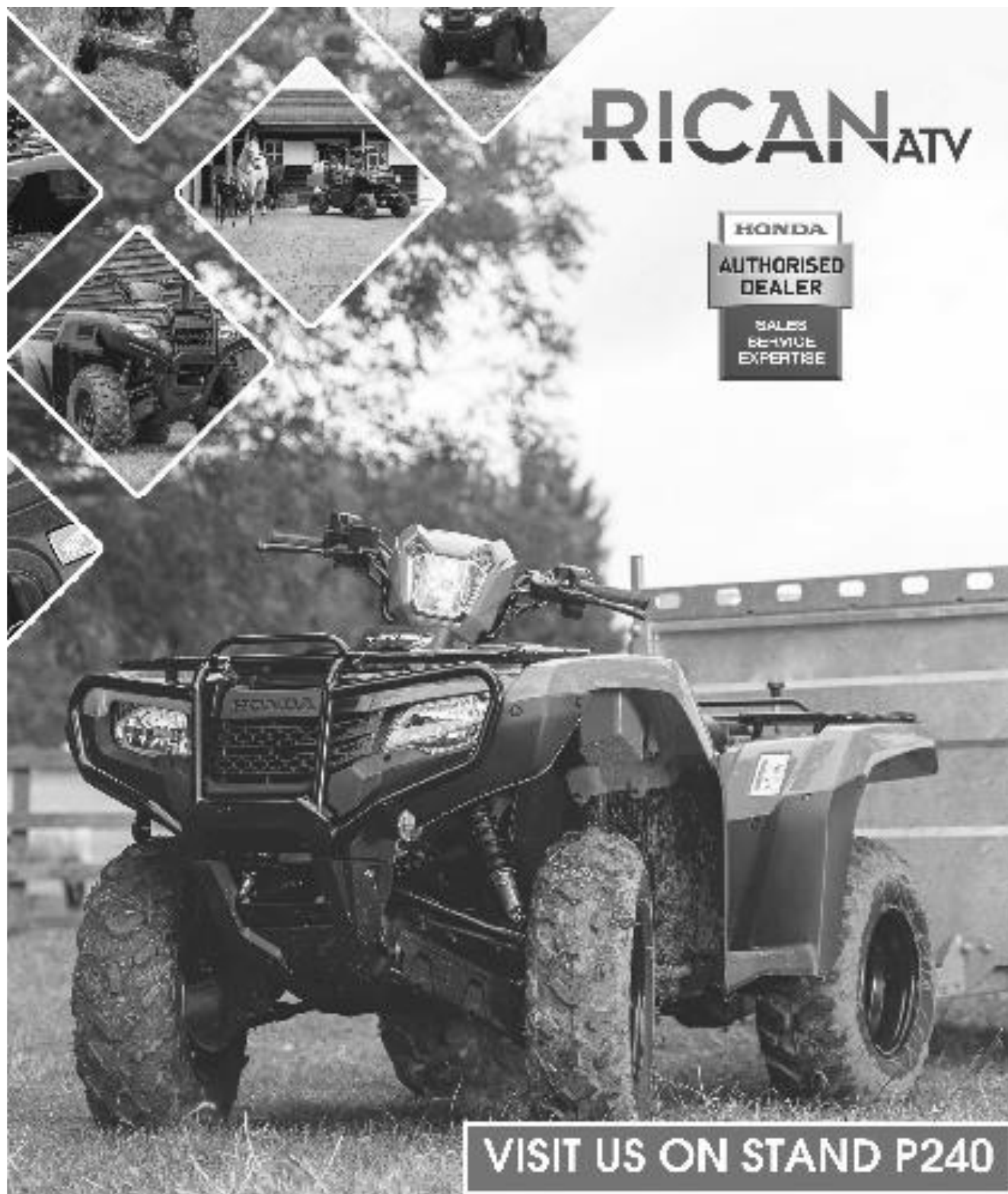
